NON-DEGREE SEEKING STATUS

Individuals with a bachelor's degree are eligible to apply for Graduate Non-Matriculated (GNM) status. This status allows you to take graduate-level, non-clinical nursing courses without being admitted to a School of Nursing degree program.

If you later decide to apply to a UW graduate nursing degree program (for example, Master of Science), you may apply up to twelve GNM credits towards that degree. Please note, however, that if you also plan to transfer graduate-level nursing credits from another school, the combined total between transfer and GNM credits cannot exceed twelve.

Once admitted as a GNM student, you will be assigned a School of Nursing faculty adviser. Your adviser will work with you to plan your coursework and to request the required permission from course instructors.

You **must** meet with your adviser before you can register for courses.

Up to 12 GNM and graduate-level transfer credits may be applied towards a UW graduate nursing degree.

TUITION-EXEMPT GNM STUDENTS

University of Washington/State of Washington tuition-exempt students must submit the [Employee Tuition Exemption Request form](#) two weeks prior to the start of the quarter you want to enroll. This must be done each quarter you enroll as a GNM student.

Tuition exemption cannot be used for classes listed in the [Professional & Continuing Education \(PCE\) time schedule](#), and you must work with your adviser to request permission to enroll in each course.

MASTER OF SCIENCE & DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY IN NURSING SCIENCE COURSES
