ELIGIBILITY CHECKLIST

The Palliative Care graduate certificate program can be completed as a **stand-alone certificate** or **concurrently with a University of Washington graduate degree**.

To apply, you must:

- Have a minimum cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 for the last 90 **graded college/university quarter-hour or equivalent credits you completed**
- Meet one of the following requirements:
 - **Domestic applicants:** Bachelor's or graduate degree in an appropriate discipline and currently working as a nurse, physician, social worker, chaplain, or other health care professional
 - **Current University of Washington graduate students:** Concurrent enrollment in a University of Washington graduate degree program
 - **International applicants:** Have a previous graduate degree (to complete as a stand-alone program) **or** concurrent enrollment in a UW graduate degree program
- Proof of English language proficiency **if your native language is not English**, regardless of citizenship*

We do not require GRE scores for any of our graduate degree applications.

DEADLINES

The application deadlines for the Palliative Care graduate certificate are 11:59 p.m. on the following dates to begin study in autumn quarter:

- **May 1** (priority deadline)
- **July 15**

You will complete the graduate certificate application online. You will not be able to submit an application after the deadline.

HOW TO APPLY

Applying to a UW graduate certificate is an online process. You will complete, upload, and submit all components of your application via the UW Graduate School website: <https://grad.uw.edu/admissions/apply-now/>

The UW Graduate School will charge all graduate certificate applicants an \$85.00 application fee.

During the application process, you must complete PDF forms and upload them to your online application. We **highly** recommend that you save a copy of each PDF document for your own records. You cannot access these once you have submitted your online application.

We will not review incomplete applications.

START YOUR APPLICATION

Choose the appropriate application process for your situation as described below.

BACHELORS- OR GRADUATE-PREPARED DOMESTIC APPLICANTS APPLYING TO THE CERTIFICATE AS A STAND-ALONE PROGRAM

Question 1: Select "Graduate Non-Matriculated" for your application type.

Question 2: **Select M of Nursing – Seattle Campus** for your graduate program.

Question 3: Select "Fall 2021" to indicate the quarter and year you wish to enter.

Questions 4: Select **Graduate Certificate in Palliative Care** as the area of interest.

Questions 5-9: Answer accordingly.

POST-BACCALAUREATE/POST-GRADUATE DOMESTIC APPLICANTS & INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS

International applicants: If you apply to this certificate as a stand-alone program, you will complete the program as an online non-residential student. This is a part-time program and ineligible for an F-1 visa.

If you complete the certificate concurrently with another graduate degree, you must maintain full-time enrollment.

Question 1: Select "Graduate" for your application type.

Question 2: **Select Nursing - Grad Cert Prog - Adv Pract Nurs (Palliative Care)** for your graduate program.

Question 3: Select "Fall 2021" to indicate the quarter and year you wish to enter.

Questions 4: Select either "Master's" or "Doctoral" for ultimate degree goal (it does not matter which you choose).

Questions 5-13: Answer accordingly.

CURRENT UW PhD OR DNP STUDENTS

If you are a current UW PhD in Nursing Science or Doctor of Nursing Practice student, please submit:

1. A "Goal Statement" as your letter of intent describing why you are interested in obtaining the Palliative Care Graduate Certificate and how you will use this training to inform or enhance your advanced nursing career, and
2. An academic recommendation, such as one from a class instructor, academic advisor, or supervisory committee chair, who can speak to your interest in and ability to complete this graduate certificate program to sonapply@uw.edu. A full application is not required.

REPORT PRIOR SCHOOLS

In your online application profile, report ALL post-secondary colleges and universities attended regardless of whether you received a degree.

List schools in chronological order, entering the **most recent first** and the **earliest last**.

SUBMIT TRANSCRIPTS

Upload an official transcript for **each** post-secondary college and university you have attended whether or not you earned a degree there. Current and former University of Washington students must include a UW transcript.

Although we accept unofficial transcripts, **we recommend official transcripts** as they are easier to evaluate and process. It is **your responsibility** to upload a legible transcript for each school you list and ensure that you can open the scanned file after you upload it to your application.

If you accept an offer of admission to a graduate certificate program, the Graduate School will ask you to send an official transcript showing completion of a previous degree (the Graduate School will tell you from which school the official transcript should come). ENGLISH PROFICIENCY SCORES FOR NON-NATIVE ENGLISH SPEAKERS AND INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS

This requirement applies to international applicants and current UW graduate students applying for concurrent enrollment only.

All non-native speakers of English, regardless of citizenship, must show proof of English language proficiency as established by the UW School of Nursing.

Applicants can waive the English proficiency requirements **only** if they:

- have received a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree from a regionally accredited institution in the U.S. or an institution in an approved country, OR
- can provide official documentation from the institution verifying the applicant's **undergraduate degree** is from an institution where all instruction was in English

We require minimum spoken English test scores to ensure a student's success.

If you do not have a minimum test score in each category, you are not eligible to apply to a graduate certificate that has clinical components.

Self-report your scores in your online application and request to send official English proficiency scores to the **University of Washington** (UW Institution Code: 4854).

RESUME

Include your full name, address, phone number, and email address on the first page of the resume and put your name at the top of any additional pages. The resume should be no more than four pages and saved as a PDF to upload to your online application.

Submit a resume describing life experiences, including professional, volunteer, and community activities. Include any leadership roles, professional activities, consultation work, research, teaching experiences (formal and informal), special achievements, and experiences working with underserved populations. List membership in organizations, including professional ones.

Are you conversant in more than one language (bilingual, multi-lingual)? Have you had any international experiences either before starting your professional

career or as a professional? Identify dates and positions, including a brief description of responsibilities.

Keep these points in mind:

- We are interested in knowing about a broad spectrum of relevant experience, both formal and informal.
- The Admissions Committee is particularly interested in examples of leadership, teaching (formal and informal), community service and volunteer work, special projects or consultations, and research involvement at any level.
- The Admissions Committee looks for evidence of independent decision-making skills and responsibilities.
- Explain any breaks in employment or education.
- Do not only list position titles; be specific about the responsibilities involved in experiences.

Tips for presenting a strong resume:

- Proofread for errors, including your phone number and email address. Ask someone else to proofread as well; sometimes they will catch mistakes you miss.
- Include dates of employment/activity for each position on your resume.
- Use easy-to-read fonts (e.g., Arial, Calibri); we recommend a font size of 12-point.

GOAL STATEMENT

Please submit a statement indicating why you are interested in the School of Nursing Graduate Certificate in Palliative Care and how you will use the training in your daily work.

Compose and save your statement as a PDF, Word, or RTF document.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

GNM (M of Nursing) Applicants: You **MUST** contact your recommenders ahead of time to tell them the certificate program you are applying to. This ensures they respond to the correct set of questions.

Designate your recommenders online. They will receive an email requesting that they complete an online form. **If your recommenders do not use email**, contact Student and Academic Services in the UW School of Nursing as soon as possible: 206.543.8736, asknursing@uw.edu.

You must have **two** letters of recommendation. Choose from the options below:

1. **Clinical** recommendation from a current clinical supervisor
2. **Clinical** recommendation from a peer or previous supervisor
3. **Academic** recommendation, such as from a clinical or class instructor, or preceptor

Guidelines:

1. You should have had contact with your recommenders within the past five years
2. They should be able to speak to your interest in and ability to complete this graduate certificate program.
3. Only two letters of recommendation are accepted; we will not consider additional letters.
4. Family members or friends are NOT eligible to write letters of recommendation.

You will want to brief your recommenders ahead of time to discuss the questions to which they will respond.

We ask each recommender to give their impression of your:

1. Ability as a scholar
2. Clinical competence
3. Teaching and supervisory potential or ability
4. Personality, integrity, and ability to understand one's own and others' emotional states and needs
5. Potential for leadership and professional development

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE

List any active professional licensure you currently hold. Include the license type (e.g., MD, RN, ARNP, MSW, etc.), license number, the U.S. state where the license is active, and the expiration date.

CREDENTIAL/TRANSCRIPT EVALUATIONS

If you attended a college or university outside of the U.S., upload an officially translated transcript to your application.

You must also upload a detailed **credential/transcript evaluation** for each non-U.S. post-secondary institution attended, which shows both U.S. credential equivalency and equivalent credits and grades for each course. You will upload these into the **Credential/Transcript Evaluation** section of your online application.
